



# AFFIDAVIT FOR PROBABLE CAUSE


Julie A. Dutrieux swears (affirms) that:

On 11/14/2009 Officer Brian Harvey of the Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department responded to the 2100 block of N. Harding Street on the report of a child in need of assistance. Officer Harvey located an unidentified black female, approximately one year old. Officer Harvey spoke with Jimmie Cushingberry and Asiah Sanders who said they saw the little girl walking on the sidewalk all by herself at approximately 8:30 PM that night. Officer Harvey was not able to locate anyone that knew the child, and she was taken into the care and custody of the Marion County Department of Family and Children (Child Protective Services).


I, Detective Julie Dutrieux, was contacted by C.P.S. on 11/15/2009 at approximately 4:00 P.M. after the child was forced to go into foster care. Nobody had called C.P.S. or the police to report a missing child since she was located the night before. I released a photo of the little girl to the media, and I was contacted by Officer Nicole Headlee at approximately 2:00 A.M. on 11/16/2009. Officer Headlee was taking a report from April Cosby, and Mrs. Cosby told her that she believed the missing child was her 11-month-old niece, Nevaeh House. Also on the scene was Aaron Sanders, 41 years old. He said he left the child in the care of her mother, Tuesday House, at around 4:00 P.M. on 11/14/09. Both April and Aaron told Officer Headlee they believed Nevaeh was in the care of Tuesday House as of Saturday afternoon.

I contacted Tuesday House, 38 years old, by phone on 11/16/09. She agreed to come to the Child Advocacy Center for an interview. When she arrived, I read her the Miranda warning and she agreed to speak with me. I showed her a picture of the little girl found in the 2100 block of N. Harding Street, and she said it was her daughter Nevaeh. She said she went out on 11/14/2009 some time after 5:00 P.M. She said she went to some friends' houses and more than one liquor store over the course of the evening. She told me she was smoking crack cocaine and drinking King Cobra beer in 40 oz bottles. She said before leaving the house she was talking outside to Aaron Sanders. Tuesday told me she left from there thought Aaron was going to be watching Nevaeh. She said when she left Nevaeh was asleep on the couch in the living room. She told me Nevaeh was able to walk, and she said she has been able to open doors in the past. Tuesday said she returned home at around 10:30 P.M., but when she saw nobody was home she decided to go out for more drinking and using drugs. She told me she was not sure what time she arrived home on Sunday, 11/15, but she said she went to bed. She said she did not wake up until 11/16/09 when police officers were knocking on her door. Tuesday said that was when she was notified about her daughter being in the care of C.P.S.


**Affidavit for Probable Cause**


**From: Julie A. Dutrieux**

I spoke with April Cosby on 11/16/09, and she said Aaron Sanders came back to her house at approximately 4:00 P.M. on Saturday, 11/14/09, after dropping off Nevaeh at her sister Tuesday's residence. I also spoke with Aaron Sanders, and he told me he took Nevaeh home to 2121 N. Harding Street on Saturday sometime after 2:00 P.M. He told me he fed Nevaeh and she fell asleep on the couch as he waited for Tuesday to come home. He said when Tuesday came home, he told her he was leaving while they were both outside of the house. Aaron said he saw Tuesday go back in the house, and he said he walked around back to his truck and left. He said it was just after 4:00 P.M. when he left the house.

All of the above events occurred in Marion County, State of Indiana.
